SUBJECT: Request for the Installation of Speed Tables along NE 43rd Street between NE 1st Terrace and NE 3rd Avenue.

1. BACKGROUND/HISTORY

Issue Statement:

The City's Code of Ordinances, Section 18-5, provides a process for citizen-initiated requests for the installation of traffic speed tables. A request for the installation of a speed table along NE 43rd Street between NE 1st Terrace Street and NE 3rd Avenue Street was submitted by the affected property owners.

2. CURRENT ACTIVITY

City Code of Ordinance Section 18-5 provides the process and procedure for which a neighborhood group may initiate the review and consideration of the installation a speed table on a local street in a residential neighborhood.

The following is the process implemented pursuant to ordinance:

1. **Request:** A request is submitted to the City's Engineering and Community Development Department identifying the problems experienced and the segment of Local Street proposed for the installation of the speed table. Residents on NE 43rd Street identified the problem as speeding.

2. **Fee:** There is no application fee currently established by the City.
3. **Petition:** A petition of at least 67% of the property owners on the affected street was returned as required by the Ordinance.
4. **Evaluation of the Request:**
 - **Verification of the Petition Signatures:** To verify the signatures Staff performed a random sample check of the signatures of those who signed the petition.
 - **Traffic Study:** Traffic studies were conducted by Broward County Traffic Engineering.
5. **Neighborhood Traffic Committee (NTC):** Pursuant to the Ordinance, the Neighborhood Traffic Committee (NTC) is to convene and review the request and findings of the traffic study, as well as, other pertinent back-up documentation.

Analysis:

City staff requested Broward County conduct a traffic study NE 43rd Street. The County performed a traffic study at the following locations:

1. NE 43rd Street between NE 1st Terrace and NE 3rd Avenue

The traffic study was conducted on April 27, 2017 by Broward County. The study counted the number of vehicles and the speed of each vehicle.

According to the traffic study the speed of the vehicles at the 85th percentile for eastbound westbound traffic is as follows:

Street - NE 43rd Street - ___ feet south of _____ Avenue

Direction of Traffic	Speed	Volume	85 th Percentile
Eastbound	20 MPH	235 VPD	26 MPH
Westbound	21 MPH	184 VPD	26 MPH

3. NEXT STEPS: NTC REVIEW/CONSIDERATIONS

- 1) Traffic volume on the proposed local street should be more than 300 vehicles per day, but less than 4,000 vehicles per day.
- 2) Traffic studies must find that a speeding problem exists. A standard of eight-five (85) percent of traffic exceeding a speed of 10mph or faster than the posted speed in both direction should be satisfied.
- 3) Speed tables shouldn't be placed in front of any parcel where the owner didn't sign the official petition in favor of the project.
- 4) Other factors to be determined by the NTC.
