**Section 105.3.2.1** Every permit issued shall become null and void if work, as defined in Paragraph 105.3.2.6 authorized by such permit is not commenced within 180 days from the date of the permit or if the work authorized by such permit is suspended or abandoned for a period of 90 days after the time the work is commenced.

**Section 105.3.2.2** If the work covered by the permit has not commenced, or has been commenced and been suspended or abandoned, the Building Official may extend such permit for a single period of 180 days from the date of expiration of the initial permit, if request for extension is made prior to the expiration date of the initial permit. **(New applications not required unless contractor is changed).**

**Section 105.3.2.3** If the work covered by the permit has commenced, is in progress, has not been completed and is being carried on progressively in a substantial manner in accordance with Paragraph 105.3.2.6, the permit shall be in effect until completion of the job.

**Section 105.3.2.5** If a new building permit is not obtained within 180 days from the date the initial permit became null and void, the Building Official is authorized to require that any work which has been commenced or completed be removed from the building site; or alternately, he or she may issue a new permit, on application, providing the work in place and the required work to complete the structure meets all applicable regulations in effect at the time the initial permit became null and void and any regulations which may have become effective between the date of expiration and the date of issuance of a new permit.

**Exception:** On written request from owner or the contractor, the Building Official may reinstate the permit one time. The job shall be completed under the jurisdiction of the code that the original permit was approved under. The reinstated permit shall be subject to the life safety requirements as determined by the Fire Code Official. **(New applications required).**
